- 4. Non-California resident and international students are not charged a Non-Resident Supplemental Tuition cost. Non-California residents will be considered for <u>Federal Direct Loans</u> only. International students will also be billed a one-time <u>International Student Visa Administration fee of \$100</u>. International students may apply for <u>Private Education Loans</u> to assist with educational costs.
- The COA above is based on a student living off-campus. A student living on-campus or living with a parent will have a different COA and can refer to the graduate student cost of attendance budgets for the various components and costs <u>Graduate Students Cost of Attendance (ucsd.edu)</u>.
- 6. Books and Supply costs are included in each term's fees amount and are provided to each student. *Course Materials Opt-Out: students may opt out of textbook and course materials coverage by emailing the Director of Graduate Student Services at <u>graduateprograms@rady.ucsd.edu</u>. - 7. <u>Rady Master of Professional Accountancy</u> students pay \$1,300 per credit unit. The academic year is based on a student living off-campus and enrolled in 17 credit units Fall term, 17 credit units Winter term, and 16 credit units Spring term. Actual units taken may vary based on each student's enrollment. The 9-month Rady Master of Professional Accountancy Program requires a minimum of 50 credit units.
- Students may submit <u>Cost of Attendance Add-On forms</u> with appropriate documentation for rent and utilities, transportation costs, computer purchases and/or increased books and supplies. <u>Submission of a request does not</u> <u>guarantee an approval.</u>
- Financial Aid and Scholarships Office provides <u>Federal Direct Unsubsidized and Federal Direct Graduate PLUS Loans</u> and requires the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)</u>. <u>Private Education Loans</u> are available for domestic and international students. Inquire at the Financial Aid and Scholarships Office for lenders that accept international applicants. Your Major Department and/or the <u>Graduate Division</u> may provide other forms of financial support <u>Rady</u> <u>Master of Professional Accountancy costs and financing</u>. You may be required to complete and submit the FAFSA to be considered for some types of graduate awards. FAFSAs are available beginning October 1st every year.
- Students who are unable to complete the FAFSA and/or California Dream Act Application or who are enrolled in less than half-time (6 units), may be able to apply for a private loan. <u>Private Education Loans</u> are available for domestic and international students.
